Called to order by Jerry Corfman, President. Jerry introduced Jake Devine, Glacierland RC&D.

## Program by Jake Devine, Glacierland RC&D

- Glacierland does many projects related to the environment
- Glacierland does invasive species work
- Garlic Mustard and Dames Rocket are invasive plants. Glacierland pulled the plants at Lower Henry Schuette Park. Volunteers do this annually.
- Glacierland does work to improve water quality
- Glacierland will work with property owners in managed forest land programs
- They have restored areas that have been damaged by invasive species
- Glacierland works with United State Department of Agriculture and Natural Recourse Conservation Service
- They work on sustainable agriculture projects and animal grazing plans
- Glacierland does regional phragmites treatment. In 2022 there were 882 parcels treated
- Clean water and invasive water species is a large part of their work
- There is a clean boat, clean water program
- Boats are monitored at landings and their owners educated on how to be better stewards of the lakes and waters
- Discussion took place on hopefully being able to expand the number of boat landings they can get to
- The July 4 week they hope to have 10 people at several boat landings helping to educated on how to be better stewards of the lakes and waters
- Discussion took place on the best landings to monitor. Jake felt that Lake Michigan landing is first priority
- There is a hybrid milfoil that is a cross between the natural milfoil and Eurasian milfoil. They may be hard to identify without training
- Maria Lynch volunteered to start doing the water testing and monitoring for Little Pigeon Lake
