MEETING MINUTES:

- Called to order by Jerry Corman, President.

Jason Breeggemann: WDNR Fisheries Biologist

- UWGB student inspected 234 boats, contacted 424 people and put in 120.5 hours at Long Lake. She also inspected 219 boats, contacted 423 people and put in 96.5 hours at Lake Michigan. Most inspections were done on the weekend and she surpassed the 200 required hours.
- 2026 grant applications deadline is 11/15/25.
- They also monitored Bullhead, Cedar, Harpt, Horseshoe and Silver Lakes. 156 boats inspected, 274 people contacted and 257 hours monitored.
- Cedar Lake has their own clean boats clean water inspections. They surpassed the 200 hours.
- August 9 was the Aquatic Invasive Species Snapshot Day. They were at Weyers, Gass, Hartlaub and Silver Lakes along with the Little Manitowoc River. A Faucet Snail may have been found in Weyers Lake. It wasn't fully identified and they are keeping an eye on that.
- Drain campaign and landscaping blitz is a full week in July.
- Phragmites control is still going on at participating townships in the county.
- A person can navigate to https://www.glacierlandrcd.org/phragmites-control-project to see and report new phragmites locations.
- There are projects at Manitowoc Bluff, Silver Creek Park, Point Creek, Fisher Creek, Centerville Creek/Hika Park, North Point Bluff, Amsterdam Dunes and Valley Creek Corridor, enhancing Lake Michigan costal & riparian habitats for migratory birds.
- They currently have nearly 1,000 acres of grazier land in the county participating with Glacierland

- Bullhead Lake: They are looking for a Lake District representative. The lake had a fish survey in spring. They struggle with high phosphorus and working with Onterra from De Pere investigating an alum treatment.
- Carsten's Lake: 2 ½" Secchi Disk reading. Stantec project is currently waiting for WDNR approval of the metal to be used in the filtration bags. A memorial bench has been put at the boat landing in memory of the long-term resident John Karbon Jr.
- Cedar Lake: A whole lake milfoil treatment was done this year. It has appeared to work and native weeds have come back. Their weed cutting hours are way down. 9/10/25 the town board is having a meeting on the wake boating.

 Hartlaub Lake: Things are quiet. 5" or less Secchi disk reading. Water quality is not good. There has been a lot of kayaking on the lake.

Horseshoe Lake: They are working a lake management plan.
 Water quality is pretty good but they are listed as an impaired lake due to the 2 story fishery. It is 2 story due to having deep water and shallow water fish in the lake.

Long Lake: They had a successful shoreline cleanup in spring.
 20 boats took place in the 7/4/25 boat parade. The milfoil is bad. There is lots of boat traffic including kayaking. Fishing pressure is high. A new member Jeff Ray was introduced.

Silver Lake: They have lots of weeds. Boating has slowed.
 Fishing has been active. Had a question regarding the removal of a tree that was blown into the lake. It was suggested to reach out to WDNR.

 Wilke Lake: On 5/19/25 the lake had a whole lake treatment for milfoil. They believe that there may still be some milfoil. Native weeds have come back.

- **Soil and Water:** For the past year and a half they have been working with a local advisory committee on a 10-year soil and water plan. The Cedar Lake sediment basin is still in the works. Grants and landowner approval are pending. Surface water education grant and a mobile learning lab is being looked into. The cost for the mobile lab could be \$25,000 to \$30,000. There have been organizations already donating to the mobile lab. They have been working with Bullhead Lake and Horseshoe Lake on items pertaining to those lakes. Livestock facilities licensing is being done. Helping farms to be more proactive with land management plans and 5-year nutrient management plans. There are setback and area rules and regulations with farm expansions. Adjacent property owners are to be notified with any expansions. A discussion to place that road traffic also increases and needs to be considered when an expansion takes place. Manitowoc County has the most licensed farms in the state of Wisconsin.
- Manitowoc County Fish & Game: There are videos on their website pertaining to wake boating including underwater cameras
